

Letter from the Chairman of the Board

As Chairman, I am very aware of the women in our community fighting personal battles that most will never understand: pregnant women, abandoned and homeless, looking for refuge as they face an uncertain future. For the fortieth year, we have welcomed these frightened, yet courageous women into our homes and walked beside them on their journey to motherhood and a future filled with hope and promise.

In 2021, as COVID-19 continued to complicate life for all of us, the pandemic presented further challenges for pregnant women who were without a home in which to shelter. For them, the risk of infection from the virus was greatly increased and the ability to receive services was almost non-existent as many social service agencies remained closed or provided only virtual support through most of 2021. Homeless and without computer access, virtual support serves were out of reach for these women. In 2021, Our Lady's Inn was needed more than ever, and so we remained open and operating, serving as a haven from the storm of the pandemic.

We served ninety-nine (99) pregnant women and their sixty-eight (68) children within our two maternity homes throughout the pandemic. Seventeen (17) babies were born to mothers while in residence. Under our roof they found safety, encouragement and nourishment for mind and body. They discovered hope for a promising future - a future made even brighter with the opportunity to heal from past abuses and trauma. We served an additional sixty-six (66) mothers and their one-hundred sixteen (116) children in our post-residential Aftercare Program.

Fiscal Year 2021 ended with Our Lady's Inn in a sound financial position. Executive Leadership worked tirelessly to secure a broad base of funding resources while expertly managing expenses. Many of the front-line staff remained committed to working throughout the pandemic; some COVID related attrition did occur, and we saw Leadership step in to fill the gaps ensuring the life-saving work of Our Lady's Inn was carried out.

As I prepare to hand over the mantel of Board leadership to a newly elected Chairman, I remain on the Board and active in this life saving work. I recognize the contribution of each employee, volunteer, and Board member and thank them for their continued efforts. I am grateful for our donors who have so generously supported the work of Our Lady's Inn. Together, we work to carry out the life-saving mission of supporting pregnant, homeless women and their children and helping them to secure a hope-filled future.

The Long Road Home

While many expectant moms spend their third trimester anticipating with joy the birth of their baby, preparing a nursery, folding baby clothes and attending baby showers, Sara was looking for safe shelter. She had been abandoned at a hospital at 6 months pregnant. Thankfully, she and her 3-year-old found Our Lady's Inn. In the year that her family lived at the Inn, Sara was supported in preparing for birth and was nourished physically and emotionally. She participated in many in-house programs and completed 30 college credits. She says, "I learned to gather a community of people around me and my kids. I was able to have a safe harbor and we were able to thrive."

After completing the program, Sara stayed connected with Our Lady's Inn through the two-year Aftercare Program. Case Managers offered her continued guidance and support, help with diapers and other material needs for her baby, and never-ending encouragement. She loved that there was someone to "help me stay on course and cheer me on." Since then, we've had a lot of reasons to cheer for her!

Sara has fulfilled her career goal of becoming an accountant, and recently purchased her first home. She has worked diligently to set herself and her family up for continued success and stability. As she reflects on her time at Our Lady's Inn and where it has led her, she shares this: "I have worked hard to make a community for me and the kids because being a single parent is not easy. I have my kids in a lot of different programs to make sure they have everything they need to be a success when they are older."

We are wishing Sara the best for her family as they continue toward a hopeful future!




