Preparing for the Future

From the Chairman of the Board

2024 found Our Lady's Inn moving closer to achieving our goal of Preparing for the Future with a new St. Louis County facility. At the same time, we remained focused on fulfilling our mission offering life-affirming care for unhoused pregnant women and children.

We completed strategic planning in the Fall, deepening our commitment to our Mission, Vision, and Values, and determining a path forward into the future.

We provided over 13,000 nights of shelter for 94 families, supported 76 families in the Aftercare Program, and shared in the joy of welcoming 25 newborns.

I am proud of our financial picture. We continued to show excellent stewardship of the revenue from donations, grants and fundraising activities. Donations were supported by a 70% Missouri Maternity Home Tax Credit. Our auditors reported an Unmodified (Clean) Opinion. Charity Navigator awarded Our Lady's Inn its highest rating - 4 Star with a score of 100%.

Our Lady's Inn completed a successful programmatic examination and was once again issued the highest level of accreditation by the Commission of Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF International). This is important validation of our commitment to maintaining quality standards and continued improvement.

Yet, our work continues and our challenges for 2025 are significant! Our aim to expand into St. Louis County with a new facility has taken a giant leap forward, acquiring a seven-acre site early in 2024. Preliminary site work has begun; planning and construction bidding are underway, and a Comprehensive Campaign is ready to be launched.

Our Board continues to have the utmost confidence in our leadership team and staff who carry out our mission daily and meet the challenge of opening a new home for the benefit of the mothers and children we serve.

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Hope Continues

Britney lived at Our Lady's Inn for 13 months. During that time, she took advantage of many in-house classes offered to her: Family Wellness and Parenting, Pregnancy and Childbirth, Nutrition, and Safe Sleep. She also participated in empowerment programs such as Project Strong and the Change Program facilitated by our Director of Counseling.

Due to the debilitating effects of a traumatic brain injury, Britney had many needs. Her Client Advocate worked tirelessly to connect her with Goodwill Industries' Brain Injury Program. OLI's nurse referred her to

Labor of Love Doula Services for advocacy support during delivery and SLU Physical and Occupational Therapy Services to assist with her mobility needs. Britney partnered with OLI's Child Advocate and Parents as Teachers to learn as much as she could about child development and parenting techniques.

Working with her Client Advocate, Britney secured permanent supportive housing, a program which offers long-term case management and resources. We are happy to share that Britney has now been living in her own apartment for 3 years.

Upon moving from the Inn into her own apartment, Britney joined OLI's Aftercare Program. Last year, she availed herself of support from Vocational Rehabilitation Services to find employment, with her Aftercare Case Manager coaching her through the interview process. Britney enjoys her work and looks forward to "making her dreams come true" and "making a difference every day". She is already making a difference as she continues to volunteer at Our Lady's Inn's Twice Blessed Resale Shop, which she began doing during her stay at the Inn. She is setting a beautiful example for her son by paying it forward.

Britney is very proud of her little boy! She knows, as we do, that every life is a cherished gift from God-including her own. We are honored to continue our walk with Britney in the Aftercare Program as she embraces her future of stability and hope!




